BECOMING A LICENSED MASTER SOCIAL WORKER

(LMSW) in New York State

ELIGIBILITY IN NEW YORK STATE

- Be at least 21 years of age.
- Be of good moral character as determined by the New York State Department of Education (NYSED).
- Meet educational requirements: a CSWE accredited MSW program, like the UB MSW program.
- Complete coursework or training in the identification and reporting of child abuse offered by a NYS approved provider. Both SW 520 and SW 540 satisfy this requirement.
- Pass the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) Exam.

HOW TO OBTAIN LICENSURE

- Submit online application for licensure (form 1) and the \$294 fee: https://eservices.nysed.gov/professions/
- Submit the certification of professional education (form 2) to the UB Registrar to verify your education directly to NYSED: http://www.op.nysed.gov/prof/sw/lmsw2.pdf
- NYSED must approve your education and application materials and will notify ASWB of your exam eligibility.
- will notify ASWB of your exam eligibility.

- Once approved, make an exam appointment at a Pearson VUE test center. The exam fee is currently \$230.

BENEFITS OF PURSUING LICENSURE

- Being licensed is a selling point to employers and may unlock future career opportunities.
- Licensing is a legal matter the primary purpose of licensing is consumer protection.
- To legally practice social work in New York State, social workers must be licensed and registered or have a limited permit, or be practicing in an exempt setting.

IMPORTANT TO KNOW INFORMATION

- Licenses do not expire; renewal is every three years. Licensure status is public knowledge and can be accessed at: http://www.op.nysed.gov/sw/
- An LMSW will not have to complete continuing education during your initial three-year registration period
