

	Curriculum	Funding
Year 1	Coursework	Tuition waiver <sup>1</sup> + Assistantship stipend <sup>2</sup>
Year 2	Coursework	Tuition waiver + Assistantship stipend
Year 3	Comprehensive exams & dissertation	Tuition waiver <sup>3</sup> + Assistantship stipend
Year 4+	Dissertation	Self-funded <sup>4</sup>

- 1 Tuition waiver = full tuition coverage at in-state rate for domestic US students (out-of-state rate for international students) for up to 47 credits.
- 2 Assistantship = 20 hours/week, 12 month appointment; \$16,000 per year.
- 3 Tuition waiver in Year 3 applicable only if students have not reached the 47 credit limit.
- 4 Beginning in Year 4 (and/or 47 credits), students must secure their own funding (e.g., working on a faculty research grant, teaching, serving as a field liaison).

- MSW (from CSWE-accredited institution) or international equivalent
- GRE within 5 years
- Resumé or curriculum vitae
- Three letters of recommendation
- Academic writing sample (in APA style)
- Research statement
- TOEFL required of some international applicants
- An interview may be requested
